profile! Digital Measures is an online information management system that provides faculty members with a single convenient place to compile data on activities such as teaching, research, and service. This stored data can then be used to generate reports such as annual evaluations, personal curriculum vitae, research and scholarly activities reports, and data required for accrediting bodies. Digital Measures helps you to record and organize an up-to-date record of your scholarly work and accomplishments. Keeping your Digital Measures account updated with your most recent accomplishments will save you time and stress when compiling reports or completing the maintenance of appointment or promotion processes.
