# June 2023 #MedEd Pearl: Creating Joy with Laughter and Humor

A great deal of our lives is spent in the workplace caring for patients and teaching learners. It is important that we are able to find joy in the work that we do AND in the environment where we work. But is there a secret to creating joy within the workplace?

Instead of continuing to just accept stress and burnout, <u>June's #MedEdPearl</u> suggests that medical educators can turn to laughter and humor to boost group cohesion, reduce stress, and improve communication. The article's author, **Machelle Linsenmeyer**, **EdD**, **NAOME**, outlines practical methods to promote humor and laughter. She also discusses the benefits of joyful activities, such as laughter yoga and sharing stories, and ways to embrace the challenge of bringing more laughter into your life.

We should all embrace the opportunity to be more joyful in our work and learning environments! This is a great opportunity to role model appropriate ways to introduce humor for our learners and colleagues in order to create a more joyful environment.

Stemmler, M.D. Medical Education Research Fund, which provides up to \$150,000 for each funded research endeavor. Expected outcomes include advances in the theory, knowledge, or practice of assessment at any point along the continuum of medical education, from undergraduate and graduate education and training through practice. Applicants may request up to \$150,000 of funding support for a project period of up to two years. The application deadline is July 28, 2023.
